The Guard Empty Hand Seminar

First of its kind seminar sanctioned in New York state was a success!

n July 2006, I received an interesting email from Mike Molinaro, Sah Dan, extending an invitation and description of The Guard Empty Hand Seminar, presented by Tang Soo Do of Central New York, with Mr. Molinaro as the instructor. The seminar was to take



place at his dojang, located in Little Falls, New York on October 7 and 8, 2006. This was the first of its kind to be sanctioned in New York state by Grandmaster Shin.

The title of the seminar was intriguing and the brochure held a promise that this would be an event not to be missed. After reviewing the details of the seminar and Mr. Molinaro's adept credentials, I hastened to return the registration form. In order to provide a favorable student-teacher ratio, the number of participants was to be limited.

Upon arrival in Little Falls, Mr. Molinaro gathered the group for a quick tour and town history lesson, followed by a late dinner at a local restaurant. It was then time to retire to rest for an early start of the seminar on Saturday morning.

The participants converged at the dojang early Saturday morning. In attendance were Master Scott Homschek, Linda Russo, Ellen Paine, Roy Donaldson, Mike Porco, Jr., Cesar

Fernandez, Jeff Schwartz, John Roumanis, Stewart Soon and Dave Cuddy, along with Mr. Molinaro's assistants, Neil Bandel and Kurt Harrington.

Mr. Molinaro has an extensive background of almost 30 years experience in the martial arts. Prior to starting Tang Soo Do in 1985, he trained in self-defense and Tae Kwon Do. His Tang Soo Do instructor, Master John Beam, ignited the spark of a special interest in self-defense techniques.

He has traveled extensively, attending numerous specialized training seminars in various techniques and continues his training with a special focus and interest in the Naihanchi Hyung.

The seminar continued until 8 pm Saturday night. The seminar moved along quickly, as Mr. Molinaro took us from one technique to another. While we practiced, his assistants helped us work on the techniques. Their patience was endless and very much appreciated.

On Sunday morning, we trained from 9 am to noon, as Mr. Molinaro reviewed the materials from the previous day. As noon approached, it was time to say good-bye to new and old friends.

A very real spirit of brother and sisterhood prevailed throughout the seminar. There always seems to be a special bond among students that have worked hard and felt a common amount of pain while training together.

In summation, this and future Guard Seminars will provide a deeper understanding of our present hyung and techniques. It has the potential to

He has challenged us to continue to respect tradition. Future Guard seminars deserve the attention and consideration of all senior dans.


Thanks to Mrs. Molinaro for providing drinks, fresh fruit and home-baked goods to maintain our energy.


